

Transcript for "Introduction to the Questions"

Hi everyone, my name is Sabrina Slagowski-Tipton. I'm the Managing Director at the Center for Public Deliberation and today I'm going to talk you through the questions and a little bit of information about how to ask those questions.

Question number one is: how has your housing influenced your health or the health of others in your community?

Question number two: how has your health or access to healthcare influenced your housing or the housing of others in your community?

Question number three: how has the Coronavirus pandemic and economic shutdown impacted your health or housing?

And question number four: what are your hopes for our community?

As you can see in the process guide attached to this module, these are the four big bucket questions and we have recommended probing questions within those four big buckets for you to use as well. Once you've asked all these four questions and several probing questions underneath, we will then ask you to solicit some optional demographic information from your participants.

Our first demographic question is: how long have you lived in Fort Collins? If your participants don't live in Fort Collins just make a note of what city or town they live in instead.

Next for those folks who do live in Fort Collins we'd like to know where in Fort Collins they live. We don't need their address, just a general area of town or an intersection or something like that.

And we'd like you to ask your participants what gender they identify with. And please remember that if folks aren't comfortable answering these questions, they're more than welcome to pass.

Then we'd like you to ask how your participants describe their own race or ethnicity. Again this one is optional

Then please ask what year your participants were born so that we can try to get some age demographics as well

We would also like education demographics so if you would please ask: what is the highest level of education you've completed?

And finally, the city would like you to ask your participants what percentage of their monthly income they spend on housing.

Some of you may be wondering why we're having you ask these demographic questions. Part of the Home2Health grant is making sure that we are engaging a wide variety of our community, and demographic information just helps us make sure that we're doing our jobs well. So please remember these questions are optional but they certainly do help us understand where folks in the community are coming from, what they have access to, and helps us gauge our engagement efforts.

That's all we have for the question training. Please make sure that you read through your interview guide as again it has those probing questions underneath the big theme questions that I went through in this video. Thank you so so much for the time you're spending on this project. We know that you're providing a lot of great things for your participants. You're helping them with social isolation, you're helping potentially connect them to resources, and you're also helping us show the City of Fort Collins how they can help more effectively with issues surrounding health and housing.
